AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR POLICE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CITY OF ST. MARY, MISSOURI.

WHEREAS, Section 590.105(1)RSMo requires the following basic training requirements for newly hired law enforcement officers: one hundred twenty (120) hours as of August 28, 1993; three hundred (300) hours as of August 28, 1994, and hour hundred fifty (450) hours as of August 28, 1996; and

WHEREAS, Section 590.105(4) provides that any peace officer who is employed by a law enforcement agency located within a county of the third classification shall be required to have no more or less than 120 hours of training for certification if the respective city adopts an ordinance to that effect.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the City of St. Mary, Missouri, as follows:

- 1. All elected or newly hired peace officers shall be required to have no more or less than 120 hours of training for certification by the Department of Public Safety.
- 2. Newly elected or hired law enforcement officers shall have a one-year year period after election or appointment to be certified by the Department of Public Safety.
- The ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
